Tanwen's Fire Breathing Dragon

Materials:

- Paper Tube
- Glue Stick or Tape
- Red or Green Paper (You could also use white and color it whichever color you desire)
- Red, Orange or Yellow Tissue Paper for flames
- Small Piece of White Paper for eyes and nostrils
- Black Marker or Crayon
- Glitter/Jewels (Optional)



Cover your paper tube with your red, green or colored paper using the glue stick and trim if needed. Cut your tissue paper into flames and glue inside one end of the tube. Cut eyes and nostrils and glue them into position.

Blow from the eye end of the tube to make your dragon breathe.

Norman the Gnome's Dragon Eggs

Ingredients:

- 1 cup baking soda
- 1/2 cup corn starch
- 3/4 cup water

Instructions:

Sift baking soda and corn starch in medium size pan. Add water and stir until everything is wet. Turn heat to medium and cook while stirring. When dough forms a ball and pulls away from the sides, remove from heat and continue stirring until all visible water is gone. Turn out on a cutting board coated with corn starch and knead until no longer sticky, adding corn starch as needed. Air dry for 24 hours, or store in tightly covered container for up to one week. Like all clays, mend cracks with fingertips dipped in water as you work on your project.

You can decorate your dragon egg using things like glue, puff paint, nail polish, foil, buttons, stickers, tacks, nails, beads, and sequins.
